

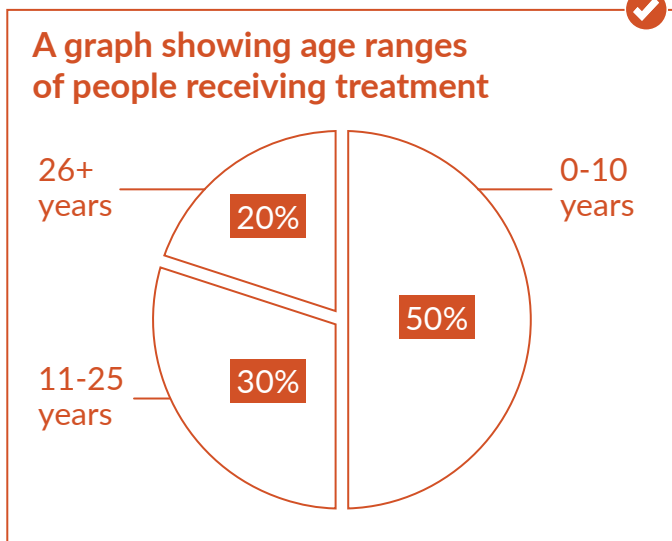

Charts and graphs must be clearly labelled and should not solely rely on contrasting colours. Use additional patterns or data labels to make it easier for readers to differentiate each piece of data.



Use a dark font against a light background

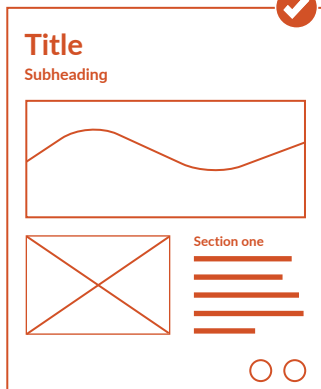


Avoid italics, decorative typefaces and underlining

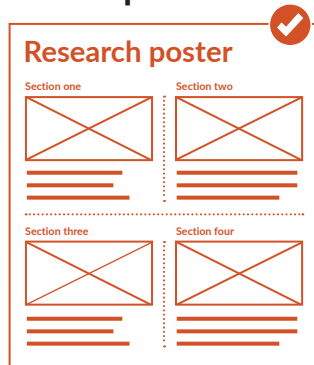
This sentence is not very clear to read because of the italics and underlining



Follow an uncluttered, logical, linear design



Separate sections with borders, headings and white space



Include a URL or QR code that links to more information on the research being presented



Provide an accessible, downloadable version of the poster

Add alt text to images on digital versions
